
Graduation Requirements at a Glance

The following information is provided as you develop your fourth year schedule to ensure that you will satisfy all graduation requirements in effect for the **Class of 2008**. Graduation requirements for your class include successful completion of:

- All Pre-Clerkship courses and Required Clerkships, including the three required fourth year clerkships: Neurology, Sub-I ICU, and Sub-I Wards.

- A **minimum of 26 weeks** of **ELECTIVE** Clerkship credit—the majority of your electives (20 weeks) must be at least four (4) weeks in length. Please consult the *Elective Requirements at a Glance* document and the policies section of the *Elective Course Catalog* for specific details relating to satisfactory completion of your elective requirements.

- The following Bioethics & Professionalism Requirements:
 1. **Case Analysis Paper** - due in the Neiswanger Institute by the start of your fourth year. Must have with a grade of Pass reported to the Office of Registration & Records.
 2. **Ethics Grand Rounds** - attendance at a minimum of four (4) Ethics Grand Rounds sessions. Two sessions should be completed in your second year and two in your third year.
 3. Completion of the **Business, Professionalism & Justice** course, which is held during fourth year orientation week. You will be automatically registered for this course when you are assigned a fourth-year track. You will receive one week of **ELECTIVE** credit for this required course that **does count** toward the 26 weeks of electives for graduation.

- United States Medical Licensing Examination (USMLE) requirements:
 1. A **passing** Step 1 score reported to the Office of Registration and Records by January 2007.
 2. **Passing** scores for the Step 2 *Clinical Knowledge* and Step 2 *Clinical Skills* exams must be reported prior to graduation.

PLEASE NOTE: An audit of your progress towards satisfying graduation requirements will be completed in late January or February of your fourth year. You will be sent a copy of the audit results; any deficiencies that must be satisfied for graduation will be noted. Although we conduct this audit as a service to you, **responsibility for satisfying graduation requirements ultimately rests with you**. Your program should be planned in consultation with your advisor to complement your medical education and competency in the various specialty and sub-specialty areas available.
