Hemorrhoids

Objectives

Rectal Pain

- 6. What are initial and follow-up management of fissures fistulae, and hemorrhoids?
- 7. When is surgical intervention appropriate, and what operative procedure is done in each of these entities? Are ambulatory options available?
- 8. How are the special problems of postoperative anorectal surgery managed?
