

ASSESSMENT AND GRADING

Your final ICU subI grade will be based on the following five components:

1. A written examination, covering the core curriculum content
2. A clinical performance evaluation, completed by your attending
3. Standardized exercise in the Clinical Skills Center on the last day of the rotation.
4. Interpretation of a patient's CXR with team's fellow or attending
5. Point-of-care ultrasound on a patient identifying several structures

The mid rotation feedback form and log of required clinical conditions are not graded but you are required to turn these forms in before the end of the rotation.

Your evaluations MUST BE COMPLETED BY ATTENDING THAT YOU HAVE WORKED WITH FOR AT LEAST 4 DAYS. Evaluations completed by residents will NOT be accepted.

*After the first 3 cohorts have completed their clerkship, the distribution of grades will be evaluated and cutoffs may be adjusted to achieve an even breakdown of 40% Honors, 30% High Pass and 30% Pass. Any adjustment will only give you a better grade – no one will be downgraded

Weighting for each assessment are as follows:

<u>Assessment</u>	<u>Weight</u>
Clinical Performance Evaluation	40%
Final Examination	30%
Clinical Skills Exercise POLST	10%
Directly Observed CXR interpretation	10%
Directly Observed POCUS activity	10%

- To achieve a Final Grade of PASS, you must meet or exceed the Minimum Passing Score (60%) on each of the components
- If you do not receive a passing score on the written examination, you will be notified as soon as possible thereafter.
- If you do not receive a passing score on the clinical performance evaluation you will be notified that you must meet with the Clerkship Director to develop a satisfactory remediation plan.

Professionalism:

Examples of unprofessional behavior include:

- Not telling your team or the clerkship director about excused absences (including interviews)
- Taking more than the allowed number of days off without permission
- Consistently arriving late to required lectures or rounds
- Not turning in forms on time
- Not filling out clerkship evaluation within 2 weeks of the end of the rotation
- Not completing SMART goal

If there are any professionalism concerns, the student will receive either a “meets with concerns” (for minor professionalism concerns) or a “does not meet” (for multiple episodes or a severe example of unprofessional behavior) under the professionalism competency. If the student does not meet the professionalism competency, remediation will be required.
