Reporting Time & Location	8:00am in Hospital Lobby; ask reception to call Mary Murphy
Food	We have a fridge and microwave if student wishes to bring a lunch; otherwise, food maybe purchased in the cafeteria
Conferences/Location	Check with your team.
Storage/Locker Location	Items may be left in the hospitalist office
Study/Rest Area	The resident workrooms with computers are located on the 1st floor of the hospital in the Hospitalist suite - Palos ID badge (obtained on first day of rotation) will grant access to the unit
Site Expectations	<p>Students are expected to wear their Loyola lab coat, be on-time and present themselves in a professional manner everyday.</p> <p>M4 students will independently, but with proper supervision, provide care for assigned patients on a medicine ward service, including all record keeping, interacting with families and other health care personnel, performing appropriate procedures, and participating in rounds. Learning will occur through seeing and working up patients, frequent discussions with the hospitalist attending about each patient's care, and a focused reading curriculum on core inpatient medical conditions. There will be a journal club/group discussion (frequency TBD) and access to Loyola Internal Medicine Grand rounds through teleconferencing. The rotation at PCH will expose M4 students to a community based medicine rotation. The student will be assigned to two different Hospitalists that will alternate weeks that the student is at Palos. The student will have one day off on the weekend, day to be chosen between student and Hospitalist. There will be a weekly 2-4 hour period with a subspecialist to either do a journal club or procedure observation. Scheduling will be determined at the beginning of each week depending on availability of subspecialist. Residents are not involved in this rotation. Medical record-keeping is not via EPIC. The student will have mid rotation and end rotation evaluations.</p>
