Orientation & Badge	Orientation will be provided on the first day. The report time is at 8:30AM on the first day to include a pediatric core orientation with Dr. Singh, Lead Preceptor.

Lactation Rooms	We have plenty of rooms on the pediatrics unit that can be used.

Site/Rotation Description	<p><u>Inpatient Expectations:</u> Students will have the opportunity to work with the Hospitalists for the IMCU, prepare a SOAP presentation daily on all patients and report to the attending during rounds.</p> <p><u>Outpatient Expectations:</u> Students will have the opportunity to work at outpatient clinics that support the local community by becoming engaged in physicians' practices.</p> <p><u>Nursery Expectations:</u> Students will have the opportunity to work with neonatologists in the nursery. During Neonatology you will be responsible for looking up pertinent patient information and be ready to present. You will round with the Neonatologist in the morning and go in on any C-sections that may arise.</p> <p><u>Evaluations + Feedback:</u> Evaluations will be completed by your teams as recommended by Loyola on the assigned weeks. You can expect to receive feedback from your intern, resident, and attending. However, if there is a particular area you are working on, be intentional and proactive in requesting feedback and guidance.</p> <p><u>Documentation</u></p>
